Cost of Attendance

Exchange students pay tuition to their home university, and room & board to UM. For the 2018-19 year, students must be able to demonstrate the proof of financial means of \$6,372US. Expenses include:

General

UM is the state of Montana's flagship public university and is located in the state's second largest city, Missoula, which has a population just short of 70,000 inhabitants.

Missoula was ranked in the Top 10 Best College towns according to Livability.com and UM's campus was ranked the second most beautiful campus by Travel and Leisure magazine.

UM serves over 11,000 students at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

UM has a 19:1 student to faculty ratio.

70% of all undergraduate classes at UM have less than 30 students and 89% have less than 50 students.

There are 200+ student organizations on the UM campus.

Washington Monthly ranked UM in the top 100 of universities based on research, service, and social mobility.

Academics

The University of Montana has 174 different academic offerings including Forestry and Wildlife Biology, Business, Journalism, Native American Studies, and many other faculties in the humanities, creative arts, and sciences.

★ In 2018, UM ranked as the #1 University in Montana according to U.S. News & World Report.

★ In 2016, UM's Wildlife Biology Program was ranked #1 in the US and Canada according to Academic Analytics.

★ In 2018, UM's Accounting Master's Program was ranked 16th in the country according to the Public Accounting Report's Annual Professors Survey.

★ In 2018, UM's Music Education Masters ranked among the best online programs in the nation by OnlineMasters.com.

★ In 2018, UM's College of Business was ranked #1 in the Big Sky Conference by U.S. News & World Report. The Big Sky Conference includes universities in Washington, Idaho, Montana, Arizona, Colorado, Oregon, California, and Utah.
