HOW TO APPLY

- 1. Pay the processing fee of \$300 CAD.
- 2. Complete the application form.
- 3. Submit the complete admission package, which includes:
 - Confirmation of payment,
 - Completed application form,
 - Copy of passport,
 - Letter of confirmation of enrollment from home institution.
- 4. Apply for the appropriate immigration document using the Letter of Acceptance.
