Below is a compilation of the eight most frequently asked questions for people interested in the Asian youth Forum!

Q1: How will the Asian Youth Forum deal with the current coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic?

We do not plan on postponing the program. The number of people will be adjusted according to Ministry of Education regulations, currently no more than 200 people for indoor activities. The total number of people at AYF will be limited to 150, and we will offer hand sanitizer and face masks for protection.

Q2: What is the solution to foreigners reluctant to fly to Taiwan due to the pandemic? Foreigners that are planning to fly to Taiwan should follow the regulations of the related policy. To ensure diversity of participants, we will also recruit foreigners or exchange students currently in Taiwan.

Q3: Benefits of Attending the Forum

Our program will feature awesome keynote speakers, who will provide additional inspiration on our four major themes. (I heard one of them is the Asia CEO of Minerva! Please keep this low-key please...) You will be able to discuss and exchange ideas with young people from other countries, in addition to the organizers which include 50 students from 15 universities. The program will also provide a valuable opportunity to hone your English listening and speaking skills.

Our transportation on subsidy provides reimbursement based on actual expenses. The maximum is \$1,000 NTD for local Taiwanese participants and up to \$20,000 NTD (about \$650 USD) if you have to fly to Taiwan. We do not provide other subsidy for low-income participants.

Q7: What are the age and education requirements?

Anyone between 18 and 30 years old is eligible. There are no restrictions on education level. The question on the registration form about current year level is optional.
