

Johns Hopkins University awarded Dr. Po-Ya Chang 'Woodrow Wilson Award 2017'



KMU alumni Dr. Po-Ya Chang, has received Johns Hopkins University (JHU) 'Woodrow Wilson Award for Distinguished Government Service 2017', an outstanding alumni award given to those who have brought it credit by their current or recently concluded public service. Dr. Chang gets her MD degree from KMU, MPH degree from both National Taiwan University and Johns Hopkins University, then Dr.MSc. degree in Medicine from Kyorin University, Japan. She is the first female president of the Control Yuan, one of the five branches of government in Taiwan. She was among the first to recognize the health problem emerging in Taiwan from rapid socioeconomic development and demographic transition, and initiated

research on occupational exposure of workers to lead and the resulting problems of lead poisoning. She was among the few health scientists in Taiwan to identify the risk of exposure by traffic police to automobile exhaust fumes. She was also among the pioneer advocates for women's health in Taiwan.
