Szeged Scientist Academy (SZTA) Selects Prof. Fang-Rong Chang, Institute of Natural Products, College of Pharmacy, as An International Mentor

College of Pharmacy, KMU congratulate her faculty member as well as alumni of Graduate Institute of Natural Products (GINP) on being selected as an International Mentor for 2019 by Szeged Scientists Academy. This is an elite student-mentoring initiative that was established to inspire and nurture top scientists of the future.

Currently serving as the director of the National Research Institute of Chinese Medicine (NRICM), Ministry of Health and Welfare, Taiwan, Prof. Chang is a world-renowned researcher in the field of Pharmacognosy and Chinese Medicine. His research interests included natural product chemistry, cross kingdom assay, genetic and epigenetic modulation for fungal secondary metabolites, transitional Chinese herbal medicine and new drug development. Prof. Chang has published more than 340 research articles and serves as editorial board members for more than 10 international journals, owns authorship of several book chapters, and holds more than 30 patients. Prof. Chang received his Ph.D. in Pharmacognosy from KMU in 1995. He then accomplished short-term trainings as postdoc scholars at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (USA) and Okayama University of Science (Japan)



for Natural Products & Medicinal Chemistry and Transgenic Plant assays, respectively. He has been a Professor at GINP since 2005 and served as its Director from 2006-2012.

Since 2008, Prof. Chang co-advised more than 11 Ph.D. graduates between University of Szeged and KMU and produced more than 20 collaborative research articles. Prof. Chang also hosted Global pharmacy program with Uppsala University, Sweden from 2007. In honored of his accomplishment and devotion in teaching and research, Prof. Chang was granted with Honarary Doctor in Pharmacy from Uppsala University, Sweden and Doctor Honoris Causa from University of Szeged, Hungary in 2018.

Special Needs Dentistry is an emerging field of dentistry. It is a "people-oriented" dental field and combines medicine, medicine, care, psychology, and sociology. KMU has been involved in the Special Needs Dentistry with since 1984. At the same time, both school of dentistry and department of oral hygiene have been working hard to try to cooperate with interprofessional researchers to benefit for people with special needs of oral health care and dental treatment.

It was a great honor for College of Dental Medicine to hold this important and meaningful conference (the 1st Congress of Asia Association for Disability and Oral Health (AADOH)) with several associations. We got the grant from the Ministry of Science and Technology to provide a platform for reports from basic science, clinical research and sharing clinical skills experience to construct interdisciplinary teamwork among dental and medical professionals, and a communication channel to overcome the economic, social, medical development, cultural and geographic variations. We also shared the innovative dentistry technologies and the latest researches (such as Disabilities dentistry, Hospital
